FICM-USA Selects Next President

FICM Field Staff member Dan Studt has been unanimously approved by the FICM-USA Board of Directors as the next president of FICM-USA, effective May 20, 2019. After months of evaluating applications, reviewing references and conducting interviews, the Board came to this decision at a meeting January 29.

Dan has been serving as the FICM-USA Northeast Regional Director of Expansion for the past 10 years. Until recently, he had also been serving as a church-planting pastor in the Syracuse, NY area.

The Board is convinced Dan will be a warm-hearted, enthusiastic, administratively-gifted shepherd to FICM-USA. His many years of connection to the Ministry, how deeply the FICM message has transformed Dan's life, and his eagerness and enthusiasm to share that message to everyone he meets were key factors in the Board's decision. FICM Founder and President Emeritus, Dr. Neil T. Anderson, also attended that commissioning ceremony and shared encouraging words to Dan and to the others gathered. Current FICM-USA President Rich Miller has served in this position since May 2006.

Let me introduce myself. My name is Dan Studt and on May 20 I will begin serving as the new president of FICM-USA, replacing my good friend, Rich Miller.

My wife, Jennifer (LaCourse) Studt and I were married nearly 27 years ago and the Lord has blessed us with four children. Abigail (Abby), age 22, is soon to graduate from Cedarville College and married Adam Cole last July. Rebecca (Becca) is 19 years old and a student at Liberty University. Elijah is almost 15 and a high school sophomore. Jacob (Jake), age 14, is an eighth grader. The boys are both students at the school where Jen teaches 2nd grade.

Very briefly, my freedom story began at age 12 when I trusted Jesus to forgive my sins. About that same time, I began struggling with habitual sins and had no idea how to be free. So, I just tried harder. Sports became my route to compensate

for spiritual failure, but frustration and anger toward myself grew because I was failing to live up to the standards taught in church. I was ashamed and believed that if I shared what was going on inside, I would be rejected.

Years later, after graduating with a degree in psychology and working in the mental health field, I realized the futility of the

secular world to provide real answers. This drove me to seminary in order to pursue full time ministry, trusting the Lord had the answers for healing. About halfway through seminary, a friend and accountability partner introduced me to FICM. We helped each other discover our freedom in Christ!

Over the process of a few years of growth, my life was completely transformed! I learned to abide with Jesus according to my identity secured by His accomplished work; chose to believe the truth of God's Word; and learned to walk in the light with other believers.

The self-hatred, anger and depression that accompanied defeat faded into the background. My marriage grew stronger

and I was able to parent out of a desire for my kids' benefit instead of wanting to look good in front of others. Soon after, Jen discovered her freedom as well.

The past 25 years of pastoral ministry have been deeply satisfying but also extremely challenging. I'm not sure where I would be had it not been for the freedom and strength Christ gives to trust in His faithfulness and goodness. God is so gracious.

Now, as the day of my "inauguration" approaches, I'm so excited to grow together with you and do all I can to help you become all God has designed you to be and accomplish the works He has planned in advance for you to do. As incoming President, I pray the Lord allows us to continue to strengthen and grow this Ministry in the US through encouraging one another and watching God raise up many, many more leaders and laborers for the harvest.

Our country is not getting friendlier to our faith, but what a great opportunity that presents to show the goodness of our God! As Corrie ten Boom said in The Hiding Place, "In darkness God's truth shines most clear."

Let's shine the light of Christ in this dark and hurting world... together!

2019 Knoxville Practicum

FICM-USA held its annual spring Practicum in the Knoxville suburb of Lenoir City, TN March 25-28. Devotional: Transitions

Wise King Solomon wrote, "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven." ECCLESIASTES 3:1 ESV



It seems like we are always in the midst of or approaching some important transition in life. From the dark safety of the womb to the rude, bright lights of birth. From childhood to adolescence (ugh!). From school days to the working years. Middle age to old age. Work to retirement. Health and vigor

to...well, not so much. Spiritual death in Adam to spiritual life in Christ. Physical life to physical death...then to the fulness of Life with Jesus in Heaven. Corruptible to incorruptible.

I wonder if there will be transitions in Heaven as well...? I hope so. If there are, they will be stages of growth without grief. Transitions without tears. Expansion of heart and mind and spirit and body, all without the sadness of loss. As the Unicorn cried in C.S. Lewis' *The Last Battle*: "I have come home at last! This is my real country! I belong here. This is the land I have been looking for all my life, though I never knew it until now...Come further up, come further in!"

On Earth, we meet some transitions with a hearty "Good riddance!" to the old. "Bring on the new; the old was a train wreck!" I think all of us would say a robust "Amen!" to that as we think of the old skin we shed and the new man we put on as we went through *The Steps to Freedom in Christ*.

Some transitions, though, are met with more of a sense of wistfulness. We realize the change is good and necessary, but what is being left behind wasn't so bad. In fact, the memories of those days are filled with life and joy.

I expect you've experienced most of these: Moving away from close friends. Changing schools. Graduations. Needing to get up every morning early to go to work. Having to do your own shopping...and taxes! Taking care of life insurance and health insurance and auto insurance and making sure all the bills are paid on time...

For those with families we experience this ambivalence when

our kids leave home for their first day of kindergarten. When they start to drive. When they have their first date. When they go off to college. When they spend a holiday at their spouse's family home. When their life calling calls them...and the grandkids...to move far away from us.

Some of you are thinking, "Hang in there, Rich. They'll be back!" True enough. They aren't called the "boomerang generation" for nothin'!

For me, there is no question that these last 13 years as FICM-USA President have been the most challenging, stretching and growing of my adult life. Kind of like a growth spurt in the spiritual realm, I would say, complete with growing pains. But it is clear that the time is right for this Ministry to have a new "head coach."

As I prepare to transition out of the position of FICM-USA President, I feel a wide array of emotions because there have been...as in any vocation...things I've liked and things I haven't. The latter category consists mainly of administration; the former consists of relationships. Above all, I will miss the people. As my position transitions, so will the relationships. That's inevitable, part of the changing "seasons" that Solomon wrote about.

As May 20 approaches, the exciting thing is that all of us on the Board of Directors are confident that, by the grace of God, Dan Studt will do a great job. Yes, he will be overwhelmed at times, just as I was. Pray for him. Over time, he will watch his shoulders broaden to fill the mantle that has been put on him. Celebrate the growth and victories with him. He will make mistakes, as I have made many. Be patient with him. Not everything he does will be the way I would do it (I certainly hope not!). Trust him or...really...trust God working through him.

As for what lies ahead for me, the FICM-USA Board of Directors has granted me a sabbatical period to find needed rest in Christ; to be refreshed in spirit, soul and body; to take a road trip with Shirley and reconnect; and to research and write a new book.

Since this is my last newsletter devotional for the foreseeable future, I'll close with some words from the apostle Paul that echo my heart:

The Lightbringers

a Freedom in Christ Course for Kids

Session 6: I Can Choose To Have Good Thoughts That Come From God
Session 7: I Am Protected Because God Is Stronger Than Anything
