It was truly inspirational to see 34 brothers and sisters come together because of a common desire to see other Christians walk in freedom. Not only did these 34 desire it, they are making themselves available to the Lord for Him to use them in their corner of the vineyard! Out of the 22 different churches represented, 17 did not as yet have a Freedom Ministry, but desire to begin one. Now that is exciting! In addition, 19 signed up to receive training and 13 wanted to start with the basic informational freedom class. Virtually all wanted to be part of the freedom network.

On the personal level, two came forward and wanted to be ministered to with The Steps to Freedom themselves before they began opening up the ministry in their area. That was especially gratifying because you really need to "own" what you are promoting. Others expressed how much being in a network would encourage them because they are aware of no other such ministry in their area. We had six different states in our region represented in the workshop – Iowa, Illinois, Arkansas, Kansas, Oklahoma and Missouri. As FIC field staff, Chapo and I will be available to travel to these different areas to do training and assist in establishing ministries. We will begin in Missouri in January. We are grateful for all who have caught the vision!

Michigan Freedom Catalyst Event (FCE)

Our final FCE for 2008 in Hudsonville (outside of Grand Rapids), Michigan clearly helped propel us forward toward our goal.

Set Free Ministries, first under the leadership of Dr. Jeff Stam and now directed by Dean Vander Wey, has been ministering freedom in the Upper Midwest for over ten years. Working alongside these dear brothers and their staff was an honor. Around 90 participants came to this event to hear how they could be released by the Lord and enter their full calling as "freedom laborers".

Chris & Cynthia Campbell (FICM Ministry Associates; leaders of GenerationFreedom), also conducted several dynamic sessions with about 20 people interested in seeing our youth touched with the message and ministry of freedom.

We shared with the group the acrostic ENTER as our prayer for those who came to the FCE. We prayed that all would experience the following:

Encouragement in their walks with God through the freedom messages taught

Networking with other like-minded freedom laborers

Training at a basic level in how to get a Community Freedom Ministry up and running

Empowerment by the Lord for His calling on their lives

Resources and ministry tools to launch a CFM in their home church or hometown


<u>Taking</u> individuals through *The Steps to Freedom in Christ* in personal appointments

A CFM can start small, and in fact, usually does start small. But as more people are touched by the Spirit of grace, truth and liberty, the ministry typically grows. Those who are set free are often very zealous to help others and so they, in turn, receive training to minister freedom.







Fresh Apple Pound Cake

From: Carol Russell

3 cups unsifted flour

2 cups finely chopped pared apple (Granny Smith)

1 tsp baking soda

1 Tbls. lemon juice (pour over chopped apples)

1 tsp salt

1 cup chopped medium fine pecans

1 tsp. cinnamon

1½ cups corn oil

2 cups granulated sugar

3 eggs

2 teaspoons vanilla

Topping:

1 cup firmly packed light brown sugar

1/4 cup milk

½ cup (1 stick) butter

Preparation:

Grease and flour a 10 by 4 inch bundt pan.

Thoroughly stir together the flour, baking soda, cinnamon and salt.


In a large bowl, mix at medium speed the oil, granulated sugar, eggs and vanilla until combined. Gradually beat in flour mixture until smooth. Fold in apples and pecans. Turn into prepared pan.

Bake 1 hour and 20 minutes in a preheated 325-degree oven or until a cake tester inserted in center comes out clean.

About 5 minutes before cake has finished baking, in a small saucepan, stirring constantly, bring the butter, brown sugar, and milk to a boil; boil 3 minutes. Pour over cake right out of the oven.

Cool in pan. With a small spatula or knife loosen cake edges and around tube. If cake does not easily turn out onto plate, warm slightly in oven to soften glaze.

For a day or two cake may be stored in a tightly covered container; for longer storage, cover and refrigerate, but bring to room temp before serving.

ThanksLiving: A Way of Life by Rich Miller

I really like Thanksgiving. In some ways it seems like it is the one holiday in our country that commercialism has not been able to spoil. At Christmastime we have to endure all the counterfeit imagery of Santa Claus and even Currier & Ives, both of which have little if anything to do with God becoming man and being born in a Bethlehem feeding trough. At Easter kids are generally much more excited about the chocolate rabbits, marshmallow chicks and butter cream eggs that the Easter bunny supposedly brings than the incredible new life the Resurrected One truly gives us.

But at Thanksgiving, it's pretty down to earth. Faith, family, food and football, though depending on your home, those four may be in quite a different order of priority! Even the cultural symbol of Thanksgiving, the turkey, is not expected to bring any gifts to deserving children, except maybe a full tummy and a house filled with napping relatives. After all, we eat the turkey!

As beautiful as the Christmas season can be, it is also the busiest time of the year. Parents flop into bed Christmas night exhausted by all the preparations, parties and presents. On Thanksgiving night, it's different. Parents snuggle up with kids by the fire and doze off with a deep sense of satisfaction and contentment. Not restless but at rest.

Maybe it's because the act of collectively as a nation giving thanks connects us to our God and Father in a very healthy and even healing way. It is right and good and gets our eyes off ourselves and onto the One who deserves our thanks every moment of every day of the year. And for one moment, one meal, we stop, get quiet and for a brief instant do what we were created to do...humble ourselves before our God and give thanks.

I'm writing this deep into one evening in early November. A few hours ago, for the umpteenth time I reminded one of my kids to say "thank you" when some food was passed to him at the table. He grudgingly cooperated, completely unaware of how incredibly important it is for him to develop a grateful spirit.

Early on in my parenting days, I was struck by the power of Romans 1:21 which explains why people will stand one day without excuse before God:

Because, although they knew God, they did not glorify Him as God, nor were thankful, but became futile in their thoughts, and their foolish hearts were darkened.

Scary stuff. The long and disastrous road to life and eternity without God starts with an ungrateful heart. From the moment of that revelation, I have been committed to seeing our kids express gratefulness to God and each other as a lifestyle. And it is with deep satisfaction when I hear one of them (unprompted by me!) say "thank you" to one another when food is passed and as I listen to them give sincere thanks to God over the meal.

Paul admonished us to give thanks in everything (1 Thessalonians 5:18) and to give thanks always for all things (Ephesians 5:20). That's easy to do when the turkey is fresh out of the oven and the conversation is lively and there's money in the bank and your football team is ahead.

But what about when the Dow Jones average plummets again? Or when your choice for elected official doesn't win? Or when the only turkey on the table you can afford is in soup from a can? Or when you don't even remember to give thanks because you are so anxious about losing your job or losing your home?


Those days of hardship may be closer to all of us than we know. But God remains the same...our faithful Father and Provider... and we can thank Him for giving us what life on earth can never take away...life and peace in Him now and life and peace with Him forever. I love what Habbakuk wrote as the days of invasion by the Babylonians drew near:

Though the fig tree may not blossom, nor fruit be on the vines; though the labor of the olive may fail, and the fields yield no food; though the flock be cut off from the fold, and there be no herd in the stalls – yet I will rejoice in the LORD, I will joy in the God of my salvation. The LORD God is my strength; He will make my feet like deer's feet, and He will make me walk on my high hills. (Habbakuk 3:17-19)

It seems like God is beginning to fulfill His promise to shake all the things that can be shaken so that only His unshakable kingdom will remain (see Hebrews 12:25-27). But the people of God can give thanks with all their hearts even as society and culture around us shake in terrible fear and insecurity.




